BUYING YOUR HOME

We'll work with you to make the financial details easy to understand, from your initial enquiry through to moving out. Transparency is important to us, and our staff can guide you through the decision-making process to make it as smooth as possible.

Our Retirement Communities do their best to offer contract options to suit your needs. Ask our Village Manager about the options available at your preferred location.

ONGOING COSTS

Once you've moved into your new home, you'll pay a weekly service fee that covers the daily costs of operating the community, which can include:

- Gardening, ground maintenance, cleaning and waste services
- Exterior maintenance of your unit or apartment
- Community management and administration
- Community facilities maintenance
- Rates, including water and usage
- Community electricity and gas
- 24-hour emergency call system
- Building insurance on units, community buildings, facilities and equipment
- Contribution to the Maintenance Reserve Fund (QLD)

Fees and inclusions may vary per community, so please get in touch if you'd like to know the specific costs and inclusions for the community you are interested in.

Meals, heavy laundry and housekeeping may attract additional fees, and you'll also need to pay for personal expenses such as your own phone and contents insurance. In some cases, electricity and gas may be included in service fees. Please ask our Village Managers for the full details.

Moving Out

The process of moving out of the community can be a daunting one as you have many things to consider. We're committed to walking with you on this journey with complete transparency.

THE LOWDOWN ON FEES

In some states, when you move out of your community, you may be required to keep paying the weekly service fee for a period of time or until your home is sold, in the same way, you continue paying your home bills until your house is sold. It varies depending on where you live and is regulated by state legislation.

When you move out, in Queensland, fees are reduced after 90 days, and you cease to pay them after a further six months. In NSW, the charges stop after 42 days, while in Victoria, you won't be charged six months after you vacate your home.

Sometimes it's necessary to modernise or substantially improve a home by renovating the bathroom or the kitchen to meet market expectations.

Once the work has been completed to make your home market-ready, we'll take care of marketing and selling of your property.

UNDERSTANDING EXIT FEES

In a nutshell, the Exit Fee, sometimes referred to as a Deferred Management or Departure Fee, is a one-off cost payable only when you leave your Retirement Community – enabling you to pay a lower upfront payment.

Many Retirement Living Communities across Australia use this model. It allows you to enjoy using facilities within the Retirement Community without the additional upfront cost to give you access to more funds during your retirement.

The Exit Fee's primary purpose is to reinvest funds directly back into your Retirement Community to cover asset replacement, community facility and unit renovations now and in the future.

It may cover costs associated with marketing and selling the units, management and corporate expenses relating to the community, General Service Fees and Maintenance Reserve Fund Contributions for units not sold within 90 days, and company profit.
